Nicholas heard of their plight and set out to help them. In the middle of the night, Nicholas threw bags of gold coins down the girls' chimney. The bags landed in the girls' stockings, which they had hung out to dry.



## Do you hang mistletoe in your home during christmas?

Mistletoe (Viscum album) is from the Anglo-Saxon word misteltan, which means "little dung twig" because the plant spreads though bird droppings. It was also believed that the dung from which the mistletoe grew would also possess "life-giving" power. if a couple in love exchanges a kiss under the mistletoe, it is interpreted as a promise to marry, as well as a prediction of happiness and long life and fertility.


#### DAY 5

Have you ever tried Wassail, a traditional Christmas drink?

Wassail is from the Old Norse ves heill, meaning "good health.

4 cups apple cider
1 cups orange juice
1/4 cup lemon juice
2 whole cinnamon sticks
6 whole cloves, or 1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
1/8 teaspoon ground ginger
1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg
Combine all ingredients in a large pan.
Bring to simmer over medium-low heat. Reduce heat and continue simmering for 45 minutes. Ladle into cups or mugs and enjoy!
